AARHUS GYMNASIUM, Tilst (AGT) is the premier international high school in the Aarhus area. We offer the world-renowned International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme tuition free to all students who meet our admission criteria. We also offer a Pre-IB year, which is equivalent to 1.g in STX. The vast majority of our Pre-IB students continue into the IB Programme.

Our student body is extremely diverse—we have Danes who come directly from Folkeskole or Efterskole, those with both a Danish and foreign parent who may have spent time abroad, and students who have just arrived Denmark for the first time from other international school systems. It is a dynamic and exciting mix.

Student life in the IB Programme at AGT is never dull. In addition to many school functions, cafes and festivals, there are a variety of student-run clubs, ranging from soccer and basketball, to chess and baking. There is also a study trip to Lisbon in the IB2 year. Students partake in active, creative and service-oriented projects as part of their diploma requirements. The school has excellent facilities including a large gym hall, auditorium with theatre lighting, and access to sports fields and green space.

The IB is a rigorous standardized curriculum, taught in English, which culminates in externally assessed examinations. The IB diploma is accepted at virtually every university in the world, and IB students are viewed favorably in the admissions process. The schoolwork is academically challenging, but our teachers have years of IB experience, and the school has

always exceeded the global average for the IB exam scores. Our graduates have attended top universities both in Denmark and around the world. We have a supportive and caring environment, fostered by a network of classmates, teachers, administrators, and alumni who return to share their experiences. There are counselors and tutors to support students with personal, academic and university related issues.



AARHUS GYMNASIUM'S PRE-IB PROGRAMME IS A ONE-YEAR COURSE THAT PREPARES STUDENTS ACADEMICALLY FOR THE IB DIPLOMA PROGRAMME

THE PRE-IB PROGRAMME

The Pre-IB year consists of a broad range of subjects, all taught with an international perspective.

This is combined with a Research and Study Skills programme and Pre-CAS, which allow the students to fine tune their ability to work independently and academically, cement their approach to academic honesty, and encourage them to think and develop beyond the confines of the classroom. Together, this enables our Pre-IB students to gain fundamental subject knowledge and make informed choices about their subject choices for the Diploma Programme.

Pre-IB is the same as the first year of the three-year Danish national upper secondary school qualifications (STX), while also preparing students for the Diploma Programme, Aarhus Gymnasium's Pre-IB programme is planned in line with Danish regulations and thus also includes important evaluations in General Science, General Linguistics, the History Research Project as well as end-of-year tests. This makes it a challenging, developmental and formative programme in its own right. Passing the Pre-IB gives students 'c-level' qualifications in a number of subjects, which can be important later, for example when applying for university or in the event that a student wishes to switch to a different educational programme, such as the STX.

Many of our former Pre-IB students have attained excellent grades upon completion of the Diploma Programme and reflect back upon the Pre-IB as a period of substantial personal and academic growth. This makes us especially proud of the unique contribution the Pre-IB has made to a significant number of our students.



THE INTERNATIONA BACCALAUREATE DIPLOMA PROGRAM

The International Baccalaureate (IB) is a two-year program, which culminates in externally assessed exams. Those exams typically equate to 50% of the final mark for the course, the other half coming from official assessments completed during the school year.

Students select a total six courses for their curriculum, including three at Higher Level (HL) and three at Standard Level (SL). A HL class corresponds to an 'A-niveau' subject in the Danish system and a SL class to a 'B-niveau' subject.

At AGT, we give our students a lot of freedom to choose the classes which suit their needs and aptitudes best. You can see which subjects are available in each of the 6 subject groups on the following page. In brief, all students must take at least two languages, including their best language at A level, and another either also at A level, B level or ab initio (as a total beginner). Students must also choose at least one course in the natural and social sciences groups as well as maths. The sixth course can be in the Arts or another subject from group 1 to 4. It is important to choose the right subjects, and this can be a daunting choice to make before you start at the school, or even arrive in Denmark!

We spend a significant amount of time counselling our pre-IB students about their IB subject choices and encourage IB applicants to get in touch as we will happily walk you through the process of tailoring a course load that's right for you!






